

Acting under the authority of the President, the Director of Maintenance serves as the senior projects manager and chief overseer of physical development, improvements, beautification, and maintenance.

### **3.8 WILDERNESS COORDINATOR**

Acting under the authority of the Commandant, in conjunction with the Command Sergeant Major and the Athletic Director, the Wilderness Coordinator serves as the chief administrator and advisor to the Commandant on all matters pertaining to the function and development of the Chamberlain-Hunt Academy Wilderness Program.

### **3.9 ATHLETIC DIRECTOR (AD)**

Acting under the authority of the Principal, the Athletic Director serves as the administrator and director of all Chamberlain-Hunt Academy athletic and afternoon activity programs. The AD, in addition, oversees the care, development, and maintenance of all CHA athletic and afternoon activity facilities.

### **3.10 TACTICAL (TAC) OFFICERS**

Acting under the supervision of the Command Sergeant Major, TAC Officers are responsible to the Commandant for the daily function of the Corps of Cadets. They are charged with the maintenance of good order, discipline, personal appearance, care and appearance of barracks, and efficient study conditions. TAC Officers serves as residential supervisors of the Corps of Cadets. The Daytime TAC Officer oversees afternoon activities, under the direction of the Command Sergeant Major and the Athletic Director, and oversees sick call procedures (see **section 10**).

### **3.11 CHAPLAIN**

Acting under the authority of the Principal, the Chaplain plans, conducts and/or oversees Sunday worship services, evening vespers, and Assembly periods. In addition, the Chaplain serves as the senior theological advisor to the Corps of Cadets.

### **3.12 GUIDANCE/CAREER COUNSELOR**

Acting under the authority of the Commandant, the Guidance/Career Counselor serves to provide emotional, psychological, situational, and career advice and direction to members of the Corps of Cadets.

### **3.13 CHAIN OF COMMAND**

The Chain of Command is diagramed in Annex D.
